
RANKED CHOICE VOTING

HOW TO USE YOUR BALLOT

In 2022, Alaskans will begin using Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) in the General Elections for statewide races. In a RCV election voters are able to rank candidates in order of preference: 1st choice, 2nd choice, and so on. One of the biggest benefits of RCV is that it ensures the winning candidate has the support of a majority of voters.

Ranked Choice Voting is as Easy as 1-2-3:

- 1. Always vote for your favorite first.
- 2. If you like other candidates, rank them in order of preference.
- 3. Rank as few or as many candidates as you like.





- ✓ You don't have to rank everyone or cast a vote for someone you don't like.
